MISSION 1.5

Request for growth:

- All Cabinet Members must keep their clubs in good standing, ensuring at least 20 active members and adding at least 1 new member.
- Past District Governors (PDGs) must contribute by adding at least one new member or sponsoring/establishing a new club.
- GMT and GET Coordinators must charter at least one new club.
- District Governors must charter a new club with at least 25 members.
- Both Vice District Governors must each charter one new club.
- A Cyber Club should be promoted with at least 5 local and 15 international members.
- At least 5 Specialty Clubs and Branch Clubs should be encouraged for establishment.
- Active support must be provided for the establishment of Ladies Clubs, Leo-to-Lions Clubs, and clubs targeting youth and young people.

GAT Zoom Review Meeting with PMCCs & PDGs (GAT Ambassadors of Nepal)– MD 325,

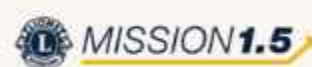
1 September 2025 – PMCCs & PDGs (GAT Ambassadors of Nepal)

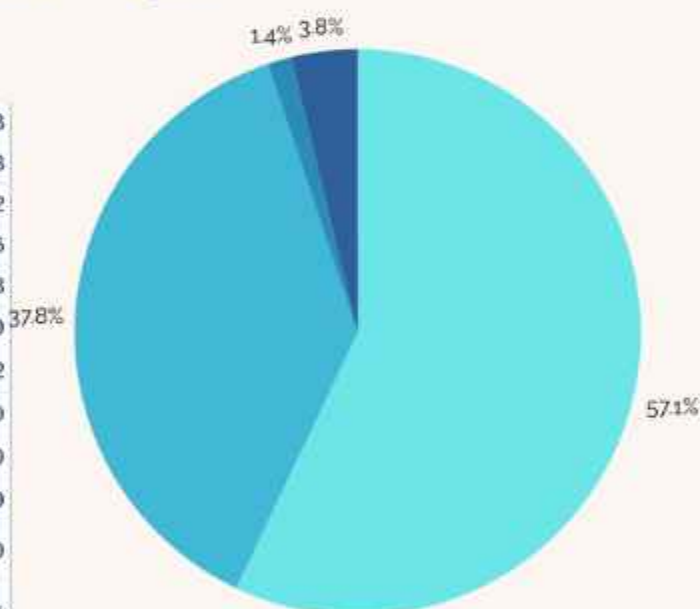


Current Membership status – MD 325, - 12th November, 2025

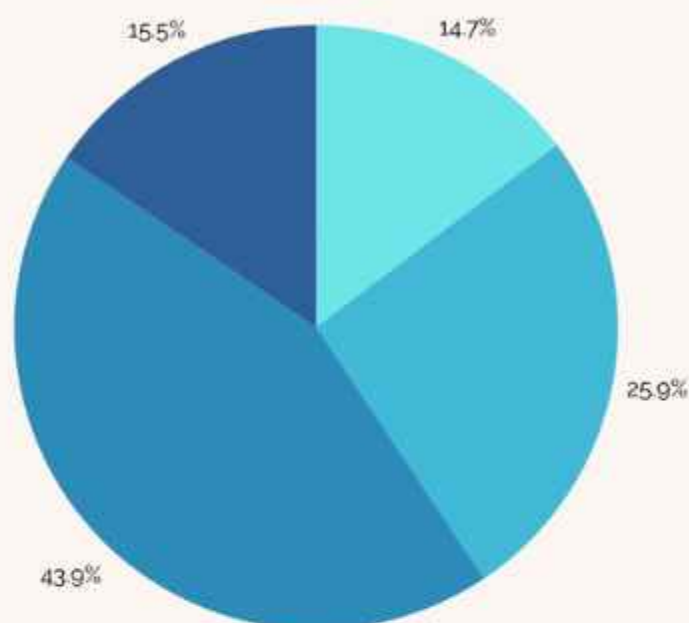

Club Status as per members, MD 325, Nepal

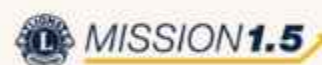

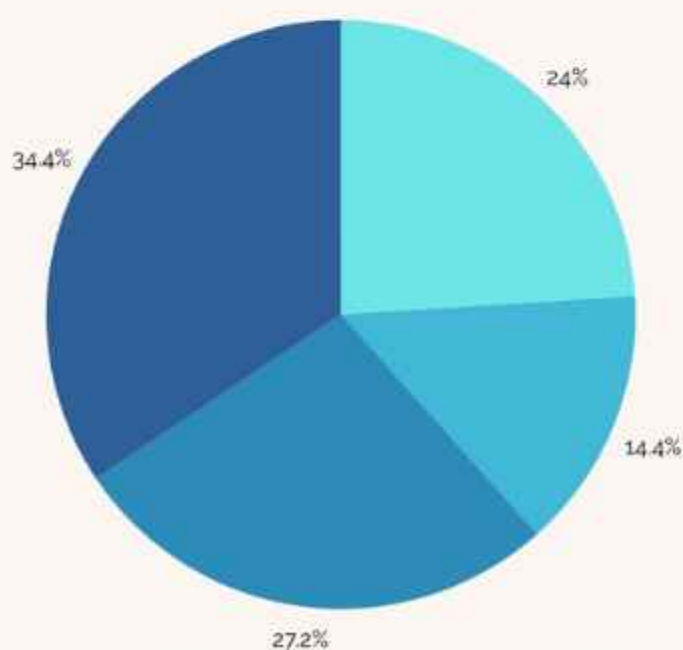

Phase I (2000–2006): Foundation Period

- Stable 200 clubs level; members around 5,000.
- Establishment of governance and training frameworks.

Phase II (2007–2015): Rapid Expansion

- Membership rose from 6,300 to 15,000.
- New clubs surged > 130 %.
- Strong leadership initiatives and national outreach.

Phase III (2016–2021): Transformation & Digital Era

- Jump from 19,981 → 42,876 members.
- “LCI policy”, GAT system, and service visibility.
- Record annual increase (+9,562 in 2020–21).

Phase IV (2022–2026): Quality, Retention & Balance

- Stabilized above 40,000 members.
- Slight correction then renewed growth to record 46,137.

Focus on member satisfaction, Leo transition, and club health.

Awards for Membership Growth



Past District Governors have unique opportunities to earn exclusive awards as part of Mission 1.5. Here are some specific awards designated for Past District Governors:

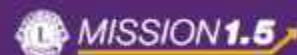
Growth Champion Pin :

- Silver Growth Champion : Awarded for sponsoring at least 2 new members in a Lion year.
- Gold Growth Champion : Awarded for sponsoring at least 5 new members in a Lion year.



Extension Champion Pin :

- Awarded for chartering a new club during Mission 1.5.



Recruitment Award

The Recruitment Award recognizes district growth through new members and clubs, with milestones based on the combined total of new and charter members (each new club counts as 20 charter members; transfers and reinstatements are excluded)

To qualify, a district must charter at least one new club. Awards are given at least once per milestone, with additional medals earned only when the next threshold is achieved.

Qualifying criteria

- 25% Recruitment Target Milestone – Districts reaching 25% of their recruitment target earn 1 Leadership Medal if below threshold.
- 75% Recruitment Target Milestone – Districts reaching 75% of their recruitment target earn 1 Leadership Medal if below threshold.
- 100% Recruitment Target Milestone – Districts that meet 100% of their recruitment target earn 1 Presidential Medal if below threshold.
- Leadership Medal Thresholds – Districts can earn an extra Leadership Medal for every additional 100 recruited members beyond 60. For example, 160, 260, 360, etc.
- Presidential Medal Thresholds – Districts can earn 1 Presidential Medal upon reaching 100 recruited members, with an extra Presidential Medal for every additional 100 members beyond that.



Special Awards for Membership Growth in Existing Clubs – MD 325, Nepal

- 2 new members added in an existing club → Special 2-Member Add Pin
- 5 new members added in an existing club → Special 5-Member Add Pin

Every club is also encouraged to induct at least one new member by December 15. Let's make sure every club contributes to the spirit of growth and service.

Worldwide Reporting Day – November 15

November 15 is Worldwide Reporting Day. On this day, Nepal's Mission 1.5 Progress Report – including each district's performance – will be presented to international executives.

Let us all work together to add new members and charter new clubs by November 15 to strengthen Nepal's presence on the global stage.

We deeply appreciate and take great pride in PID & CA Leader Lion Sanjay Khetan for his tireless efforts and inspiring guidance, and Area Leader Lion Shambhu Ghimire for his excellent coordination and continuous support.
