MISSION 1.5

Request for growth:

- All Cabinet Members must keep their clubs in good standing, ensuring at least 20 active members and adding at least 1 new member.
- Past District Governors (PDGs) must contribute by adding at least one new member or sponsoring/establishing a new club.
- GMT and GET Coordinators must charter at least one new club.
- District Governors must charter a new club with at least 25 members.
- Both Vice District Governors must each charter one new club.
- A Cyber Club should be promoted with at least 5 local and 15 international members.
- At least 5 Specialty Clubs and Branch Clubs should be encouraged for establishment.
- Active support must be provided for the establishment of Ladies Clubs, Leo-to-Lions Clubs, and clubs targeting youth and young people.

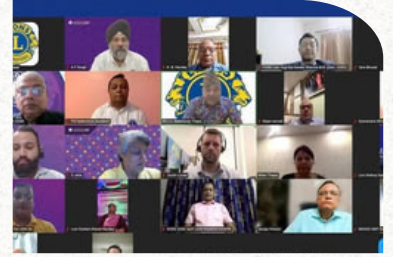
GAT Zoom Meeting with International President – MD 325, Lions International

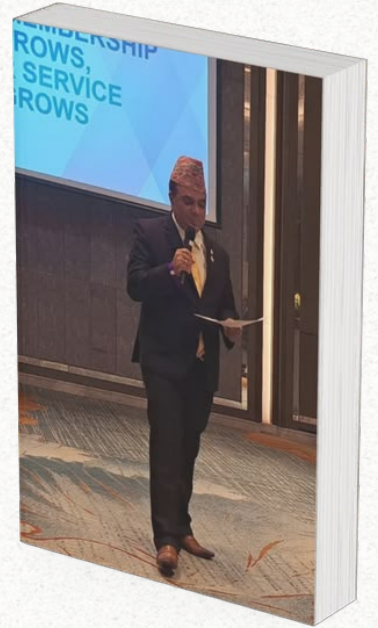

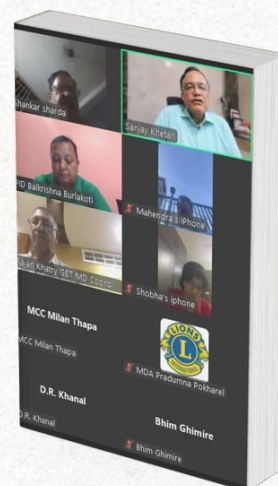

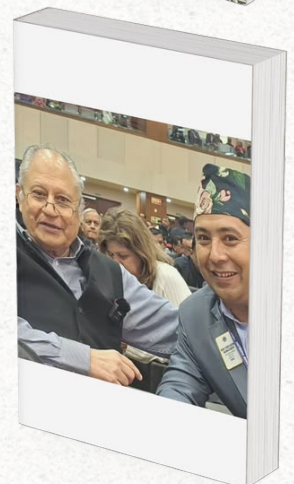
The awards were proudly received by the respective District Governors together with their GMT and GET Coordinators, recognizing the collective effort and dedication of their leadership teams.

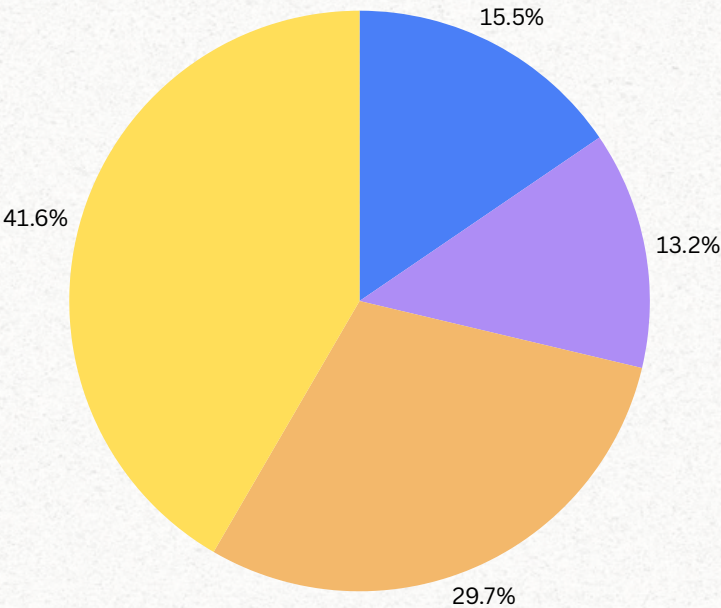

- New clubs surged > 130 %.
- Strong leadership initiatives and national outreach.

Phase III (2016–2021): Transformation & Digital Era

- Jump from 19,981 → 42,876 members.
- “LCI policy”, GAT system, and service visibility.
- Record annual increase (+9,562 in 2020–21).

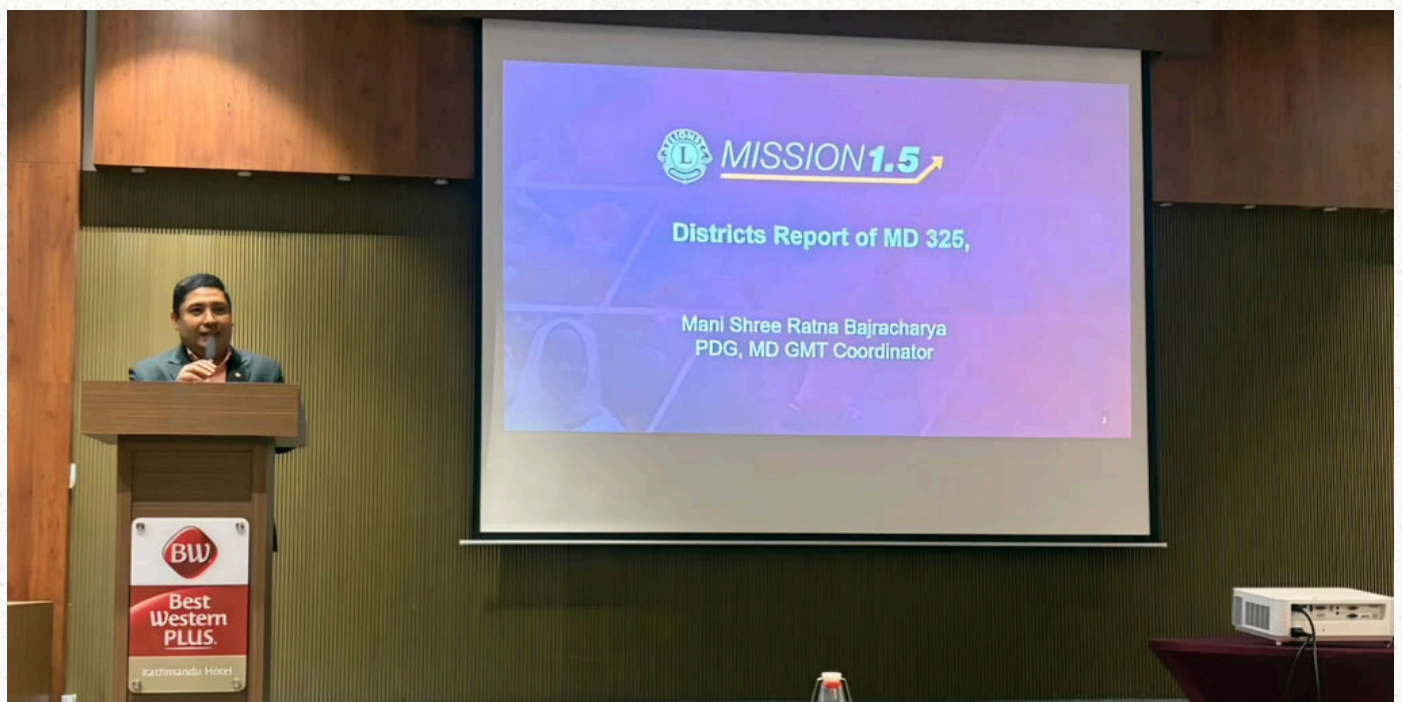

comprehensive analysis of the membership and club performance data across its 15 districts. - 2026-2027

1. Executive Summary

The multiple district (MD 325) is experiencing robust growth overall. Across all districts, a net total of 5,446 members and 273 net clubs (303 new minus 30 dropped) were added during this fiscal period. Total membership stands strong at 46,477, supported by a healthy overall retention rate of 82.1%.

However, performance is highly uneven across districts. While some districts are expanding rapidly, others are facing severe member retention issues.

2. Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)

Club Growth & Dynamics

Total Active Clubs: 2,360

New Clubs Formed: 303 (Led aggressively by District 325 K with 39 new clubs and District 325 R with 36).

Dropped Clubs: 30. Club health is generally excellent, as the creation-to-drop ratio is roughly 10:1.

Reorganized/Status Quo Clubs: 22 clubs were successfully reorganized.

Membership Inflow vs. Outflow

Total Members Added: 11,648

Charter Members (new clubs): 6,259 (53.7% of total intake)

New Members (existing clubs): 4,590 (39.4% of total intake)

Transferred/Reinstated: 799

Total Members Dropped: 6,202

The Leaky Bucket: For every 10 members added, roughly 5.3 members were dropped.

3. District-Level Performance Breakdown

Top Performers (Growth & Scale)

District 325 R: The star of the region. It achieved the highest absolute growth with a net gain of 844 members, driven by 36 new clubs and a massive influx of 747 charter members.

District 325 K: Followed closely with a net gain of 801 members and birthed the most new clubs (39).

District 325 I: Holds the title for the largest district by scale, boasting 5,330 total members and 274 total clubs.

Underperformers & Red Flags

District 325 E (Critical Concern): This is the only district that experienced a net loss of members (-290). Despite bringing in 442 members, they shed a massive 732 members. It also has the lowest retention rate in the report at 71.4%.

District 325 G: While they managed a slight net gain (+111 members), they suffer from severe instability. They added 840 members but dropped 729—losing 86.7% of what they brought in, resulting in a low retention rate of 71.5%.

4. Retention Rate Analysis

The multiple district average retention rate is 82.1%.

Retention Tier Districts Observations

High Retention (>85%) District 325 C (87.5%)

District 325 P (87.2%)

District 325 L (85.8%)

District 325 J (85.6%)

District 325 M (85.6%) These districts excel at member engagement. District 325 C is the gold standard for keeping its members.

Average Retention (80%–85%) District 325 D, F, H, I, K, N, R, G, E These districts rely on heavy recruitment to offset moderate membership losses.

Low Retention (<80%) District 325 S (71.4%)

5. Strategic Recommendations

1. Investigate Districts immediately: District leadership needs to conduct an audit on why members are leaving at such high rates in these zones. Is it a lack of club engagement, financial friction, or poor onboarding?

2. Shift Focus from Recruitment to Retention: More than half of the total growth (53.7%) comes from Charter Members (starting new clubs). While exciting, starting new clubs is resource-heavy. Improving overall retention by just 5% would save nearly 2,300 existing members.

3. Cross-District Mentorship: Pair leadership from high-retention districts (like 325 C or 325 P) with struggling districts to clone best practices regarding member satisfaction and meeting quality.

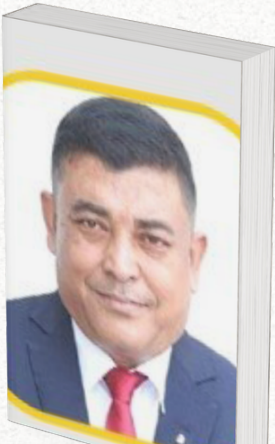

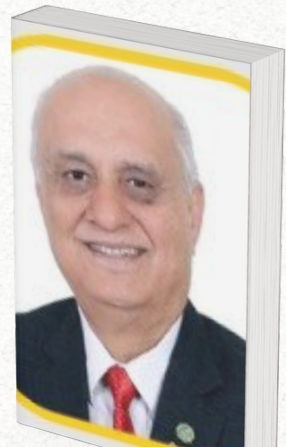
